STATEMENT OF DOCTRINE

BLUEWATER BIBLE COLLEGE is a distinctively Christian College that places emphasis on the supreme worth of Christian character. It shall seek to furnish an atmosphere in which those who desire to maintain the fundamentals of Christian faith would gladly seek their education. The highest aim of the **COLLEGE** is to train men and women for efficient Christian leadership.

The doctrinal statement following was adopted by the Board of the Trustees of the College:

WE BELIEVE:

In the verbal inspiration of the original manuscripts of the Old and New Testaments; in the triune God, the total depravity of man; salvation by grace and justification by faith alone; the absolute freeness of salvation to all who will believe in Christ; the calling by the Gospel, repentance and faith before Church membership; sanctification as a spiritual process and growth; the perseverance of the saints; a literal heaven and hell; and the eternal punishment in the lake of fire.

In the virgin birth and divinity of Christ; His bodily resurrection, Ascension, and Pre-millennial Return; worldwide missions the stewardship of life and possessions; obedience to civil governments; and the observance of Sunday as the Lord's Day, the only day enjoined upon recognized New Testament.

That a gospel church is a local and visible congregation of baptized believers in Christ; that total immersion is the only correct mode of baptism, that Scriptural baptism is the Christ chosen confession of salvation administered by the authority of a New Testament (local) Church; that only such as are thus baptized are eligible to partake of the Lord's Supper; that a New Testament Church is absolutely independent of all authority except that of Christ, its head; and that its only Scriptural officers are pastor and deacons.

In the historic position of Baptist churches in their distinctive allegiance to New Testament faith and practice.

That the modern religious trends of liberalism, neo- orthodoxy, neo- evangelicalism, ecumenicalism and the charismatic movement erroneous. (Each student admission in BBC must be willing to sign this doctrinal statement.)

STANDARD OF CONDUCT

Because the aim of **BLUEWATER BIBLE COLLEGE** is to give each student an education with the stress upon the development of Christian character, it is purposed that college life for each student be so guided as to permit the highest possible physical, mental, social, and spiritual development. The so-called "new morality" has no place in the life of a Christian.

PERSONAL STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

When a student goes away to Bible College, his friends, his church, his family, and the world, in general, expect a higher standard of life from him. There are many details of life which of necessity must be regulated by the College. As a result, personal standards of life must be on the very highest plane, not only to assist the student in forming, life-long habits which honor the Lord, but also to protect the name of the **COLLEGE** from conduct which, though sincere, might be misunderstood by others. If a student is not willing to submit his personal life to the discipline of the Word of God or to the godly guidance of the faculty, he should not come to BBC.
